KNOCK YOUTH CLUB ISLE OF LEWIS...

had an overnight stay at a youth centre where young people had chance to try gorge scrambling, archery, and being away overnight for the first time. "It was amazing, epic, when can we go back?" Young person.

TURRIFF GUIDES...

organised a Film and Theatre appreciation. "It's much more work than I thought it would be but it's good when the younger members enjoy what You plan and it works out." Young Leader.

4TH INVERNESS GUIDE UNIT...

had a 3-day trip to Edinburgh staying in youth hostel accommodation. The trip aimed to help young people develop team working and independent travel skills. "Feel like I could travel independently now." Young person.

TOUCHDOWN UK- WEST FIFE SAINTS...

invested in American football kit. As a result, young people increased their confidence, skills and fitness on and off the pitch. "I like the environment, the people are good and I can be myself." Young person.

HIP HOP SCHOOL SCOTLAND...

provided music, dance and street poetry workshops for young people in remote, deprived areas, as well as young people who experience behavioural problems at school. "We hear that a lot of the young people are doing well and are living a more positive life in school and the community." Leader.

135TH GLASGOW BB COMPANY...

had a weekend camp with sailing and mountain biking. "Getting boys away from the city to a very rural environment and being away from home for the first time." Leader.

LONGNIDDRY EXPLORER SCOUTS...

enjoyed a week walking the Great Glen Way. The grant made the trip more accessible to young people from all backgrounds. "Being able to subsidise these 'big ticket' trips means that no-one is left behind." Leader.

1ST LOCHWINNOCH GIRLS' BRIGADE...

encouraged participation in physical activities that young people had not done before, helping them to build confidence and self-esteem. "This was a great exercise to broaden the girls' horizons and improve self-esteem." Leader.

CUMMERTREES YOUTH GROUP...

built a shed to store youth club equipment. Young people gained practical skills such as reading a plan, mixing cement, and using tools. "Great experience as we're not allowed to use drills or hammers at home." Young person.
